

Silos of Concerns and Actions Summary from July 6th, 2026

Thank you one and all for your active participation in the fun, interesting, important exercise last Monday. The results are much as you might expect, with the three “Biggies” rising to the head of the pack as Silos of Concern:

Voting (60 dots)

Corporate money out of Politics (20 dots)

NM Politics (16)

Immigration (11)

Environment/Public Lands (9)

US Politics (7)

The **Actions** suggested to address these areas are creative, smart and have a very good chance of impacting our efforts to fight fascism on several fronts.

Voting: Phone Banking got a high rating of 7. Poll watching and canvassing both rated a 6.

Corporate Money out of Politics: Legislation to restrict corporations licensing to limit donations. Rated 8 dots. Other dots landed on ID Corporations who contribute to campaigns and Rewrite Hawaii’s Law to work in NM, both had 2.

NM Politics: Foster Relationships with our Elected Officials, 3 dots. Support modernizing State Legislature, 3 dots.

Immigration: Push local reps for improved conditions at detention centers, 2 dots.

Contact Somos and Contigo for guidance and target ICE Vendors, Make safe spaces, 1 dot each.

Environment and Public Lands: Join allied groups for public events, 2. Partner with Indigenous Nations follow their lead, 1. Meet with Land Commissioner for laws of protection, 1.

US Politics: Call your Senators, 2. Tune into Indivisible National meetings, 1. Collaborate with other Indivisible groups, 1.

Please Note: If you had a Concern or Action that you are super excited about and committed to, but it was not one that most dots landed on...**DO IT ANYWAY!!**

As we have learned many times, one person’s idea and passion can create a movement and gather energy to create change.

All ideas that fit within our agreed-on norms are welcome and supported.

Let’s keep up the good work with consensus building, focusing our efforts, and being on the forefront of moving the needle in local politics and nationally.

If you missed this opportunity, we will be repeating this as needed to refocus and build momentum around important actions.
